



## What to Do With All That Art Work Your Child Makes in My Class!!!

1. Frame it in a picture frame and hang it up.
2. Turn it in a scrapbook page in your child's Scrapbook
3. Have a box labeled with your child's name on it and store it there after displaying it or praising your child for their hard work.
4. Make a Language Book With their paper artwork. Write down dictations of what your child says about the picture. If your child is non-verbal, name objects for him or her to point to. Talk about the picture and expand the language your child uses.  
  
For example: the picture could be of the beach with sand and water. The child may say, "ocean" or "water", and parent can expand on that by saying , "It is beautiful blue water that would be fun to play in. Will the water feel hot or cold? Brrr, I bet the water will be cold." Or you can ask your child to point to the water in the picture.
5. Make a greeting card to send family members. Fold a piece of construction paper in half and cut out child's picture to glue onto the card. Help your child trace or write their name.

6. Turn it into wrapping paper to wrap that special gift in.

7. Smaller pieces of artwork can be made into gift tags that the recipient will cherish forever.

8. The art work can be the child's gift to a family member.
